
January Character Trait!



Reminders from Previous Newsletters

- With the colder temperatures, it is imperative that we continue to keep the car rider line moving efficiently. We are asking parents to remain in their vehicle when dropping off or picking up their student. Getting out of the vehicle takes time and causes delays in the process. School staff can assist younger students with opening & shutting doors as needed. Parents who need to buckle their child into the seatbelt are asked to do so after moving forward and pulling into the Bus Lane.
- Please help keep COVID out of our school! If your child displays any of the symptoms on the prescreening questionnaire, the child should not come to school. In addition, any student who has been in close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 should remain at home.
- When visiting the school, we request that you contact us by phone first, if possible, to handle any school business (301-753-1760). Picture ID's, social distancing and facemasks are required for <u>all</u> visitors to Mitchell Elementary School.
- Phone calls will not be permitted as a method to change your child's dismissal routines. We require this notification in writing by 12:00 PM (noon) to both office secretaries, Deanna Gomez (dgomez@ccboe.com) and Deborah Williams (ddwilliams@ccboe.com). Please also include the classroom teacher.
- Parent / Guardians picking up their child should not park along the road/parking lots and walk up to the school during car rider dismissal. You must stay in the car rider line.
- Students <u>will not be released from school after 2:45 PM</u> for early dismissal as we are preparing for our dismissal procedures. This allows for a safe and orderly dismissal of all students.
