October is Bully Prevention Month. Everyone can take part in being kind to others and we encourage our students to be kind every day. We will celebrate Unity Day on Wednesday, October 20. This special day was created to unite all people in schools, communities and online against bullying. Everyone can express his or her support by wearing orange. The color orange was chosen to represent Unity Day because it is described as vibrant, warm and inviting, and is commonly associated with safety and visibility. Every student is encouraged to wear something orange on Wednesday.

Students in grades 4 & 5 have completed the fall administration of MCAP (Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program) for reading and math. Parents will receive a report from MSDE once the assessments have been scored.

Charles County Public Schools (CCPS) will be closed on Friday, Nov. 12, for all students, teachers and school system staff. The Board of Education at its Oct. 12 meeting unanimously voted to change the 2021-2022 school year calendar and close CCPS on Nov. 12. Schools are already closed for students only on Thursday, Nov. 11, for teacher professional development and planning. The Board's vote to close Nov. 12 shifts the last day of school for students by one day to Thursday, June 16. The last day of school for teachers now shifts one day to Friday, June 17. These dates also assume CCPS uses four inclement weather days this school year. Parents, staff and community members should make a note of the change to their copy of the printed 2021-22 Parent Handbook/Calendar.

- Phone calls will not be permitted as a method to change your child's dismissal routines. We require this notification in writing by 12:00 PM (noon) to both office secretaries, Deanna Gomez (dgomez@ccboe.com) and Deborah Williams (ddwilliams@ccboe.com). Please also include the classroom teacher.
- If for some reason you must send someone else to pick up your child, you <u>MUST</u> send a note each day/occurrence (with your signature) giving the school permission to release your child to that person.
- Information about the i-Ready test for families will be posted on the CCPS website with a link to a video for students. Once testing is complete, i-Ready diagnostic scale scores and lexile scores will be uploaded into Synergy, and these scores will be made available in ParentVUE. Information on how to interpret scores will be posted on the CCPS website.
